TBF Reel KidsCasting Competition General Guidelines

These guidelines are suggestions only!

TBF Reel Kids casting programs are yours to run as your state chooses!!!

These are general rules that have been used in past national casting competitions. You can tailor these to fit your event any way that you would like.

Usually clubs will establish two casting lanes that are approximately 4' wide by 30' long. Then they will give the contestants two attempts at each of the three disciplines.

Flipping, normally done from a distance of 10' with a closed bail. (no line comes off the reel) It is an underhanded cast/swing of the bait. The contestant gets two attempts at this discipline with the highest score being recorded.

Pitching, Is done from a distance of 20' with an open bail. Line may come off the reel. It is an underhanded pendulum type cast/swing of the bait. Again the contestant gets two attempts with the highest score counting.

Casting. Is done from a distance of 30'. Usually an overhead or sometimes sidearm type cast. Again the contestants get two attempts.

When the competition is complete the best score of the three disciplines will be totaled. The contestant with the highest score wins. If your state has an advancement program then they move on to the next scheduled event.

Competition Layout

Usually the competition is laid out with casting lanes approximately 4' wide. The target is kept stationary and the contestant is moved to the three different distances which are laid out in the casting lane.

Some federations have the angler casting from the deck of a stationary Ranger boat. In that instance they would use three targets at the three different distances.
